Legislative amendments that came into effect in 2025 expanded our mandate to include offshore renewable energy and changed our name. The C-NLOER regulates oil and gas exploration and development and will regulate future renewable energy projects in the Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Area. Our mandate includes oversight of worker health and safety, environmental protection, resource management and industrial benefits.
